So to the Matrics of 2021, let me congratulate you for achieving what you have already - getting into Gr 12 after a tough Gr 11 year in which the world has to readjust and education globally had to renew. Now the last hurdle awaits and your success depends on you over the next few months. Your future is in your hands.

Your success will depend on your determination, your mindset and attitude. There is enough time and everybody is wanting to support you as much as possible. The WCED has a wonderful Growth Mindset programme (as part of the Transform to Perform Strategy) and many matrics have benefitted from it across the province over the last two years. If your school has not yet offered the short programme to you, ask your Principal to request the District to help immediately. It helps you to understand what attitude and approach to take - to realise that your circumstances and context do not define who you are and what you are capable of. It helps you individually to understand that you can grow and rise above your circumstances. It really is a wonderful opportunity - grab it with both hands.

Furthermore, there is enough time to cover all the work in all your subjects and to practice and revise sufficiently. Make sure you work every day and go over the work done in class or remotely. Speaking of remotely, the WCED online learning opportunities will give you another great start. There are so many free curriculum resources that are on the WCED ePortal.

You can access and download them using the WiFi at your school (also after school hours). The local content of the ePortal is zero-rated and does not require data. You can access it at wcedportal.co.za. You can also access the WCED/University of Stellenbosch Telematics revision videos on the ePortal or on YouTube. Every subject has a large number of matric support resources. Make sure you also get the WCED matric support booklet prepared by the WCED. Ask your teacher to ask the District if you did not get a copy. There are great study and exam tips in it for every subject.

So, as you prepare, consider the following:

- Go over every day's work again that evening
- Do as many exercises as possible - practice helps
- Go through old matric examination papers (these are also available on the WCED website (wcedonline.westerncape.gov.za))
- Ask your teacher what you do not understand and ask him/her to explain it again
- Attend matric revision sessions/Saturday classes/holiday classes. It helps to note and focus on key content, concepts and required skills

I want to wish you everything of the best. You have already shown great resilience - that is why you are where you are. And if you could get into Gr 12, you can successfully get out of it! J Enjoy the rest of your unique matric year. Tackle it with a positive "I can" attitude and make sure you do your part every day going forward! **I know you CAN do it!**

5. Did you apply for financial aid?

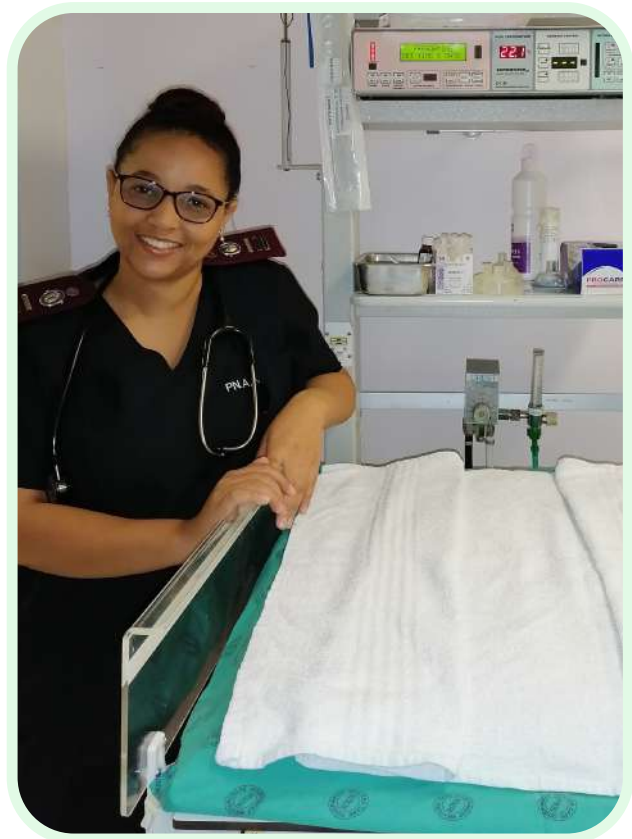
I received a Western-Cape Nursing Bursary and I also received NSFAS.

The 'transformed Andre' will soon be a pharmacist

I always get excited when people ask me how I got it right to get seven 7s on school because it opens a door for me to be able to share my story with people and quite possibly be able to make a difference in their lives. Because I know how hard it is to get a good life for ourselves and everyone wants a good life.

So first, people need to understand that it's not difficult at all. It's easy. In primary school, was never the best performer. I got a diploma here and there for a subject or two. I was just by no means driven to be the best; I just did the minimum to make sure I was progressing to the next grade. I was much more about sports than academics.

But let me explain why I'm saying it's easy to perform well. Many people's initial perception of school is that it is difficult and that you have to do the difficult work that you don't like every day. And this perception puts a lot of students on the back foot yet before they really start school. I believe that no one will ever perform well if they have to do something they don't like. A very simple example I can make is when a Mother asks a child to clean the house and that child doesn't like cleaning. When that mother comes home and sees a lot of things that she's not going to be happy with. Maybe the floors aren't mopped well or maybe the cupboards aren't swept off properly, but the concept is that when you have to do something you don't like, then by nature you're not going to give your best effort and you will never be able to do it to the best of your means. At primary school, I didn't like school, I just went every day because I had to. I just liked mathematics and sports.

And then at school, everything changed for me. I changed my whole mentality of schooling. I started to make small changes first. I started choosing just one subject that I wanted to pay most of my attention to. I then fell in love with the one subject, maths. Since I developed that love for mathematics, I've probably started doing 3 times better in maths compared to when my mentality was still poor.

And so I continued. Every time I finished developing a love for one subject, I chose another subject that I gave more attention until I developed a love for all my subjects. And that's how I changed my mentality about school. Once my mentality was right, everything just fell into place for me until I got 7s for all my subjects at the end of my school career. So yes I really believe it's not hard. The problem is not what needs to be done, but how you feel about what you should do. And it's easy to make time to work on yourself if you're just starting to make small changes in your life. A good recipe of values that I appropriated in my life, which really carried me through the whole process of self-development, was faith in God, discipline, respect and hard work. Any person with these values believes I can obtain anything. Even if you don't even have a support system or all you live under the harshest circumstances.

Right now, I'm studying pharmacology as a third-year student. It was never one of my dreams. I actually wanted to do engineering, space was limited at University thus I did not get into that program. I would like to try and do the course in engineering when I finish this course.

The course for pharmacology caught me off-guard. I didn't know anything about the field so the material they had was completely new to me. And no one warned me that varsity was so much different than school. It really takes some time to adjust to the transition from school to varsity. If I have to advise someone to help with the transition then I'll say, Open your mind to accept the changes and don't use the study methods that you used in school because it doesn't work at varsity. The sooner you accept that varsity is a lot of work and that you have to literally work every day (weekends included) the better your experience of varsity will be. Because the more you work, the more you can rest. If you do the minimum, then you don't even get time to breathe. But again nothing is difficult if your mentality is right". But overall my experience of varsity is very nice, to be honest. Varsity life comes with lots of nice things and benefits.

I have not yet made a decision on where I want to work, I will be checking the closer I get to the end of the course.

The impact of covid-19 is different for everyone. For me, the impact of Covid has made things a little better, because we work online now. I find the online studies much better than the usual way of doing things.

Almost everything from pharmacy is very interesting. We learn a lot about medicine and people's behaviors about medicine. We learn a lot from how to practice pharmacy. That is basically what is interesting about pharmacy. You not only learn about medicine, you are also taught how to be professional, paired with lots of personal development. I really came to learn a lot in the time I did the course. I would recommend it to anyone. But of course, there are requirements that you need to adhere to. As you need to do science subjects at school and you must meet the requirements in all your subjects that are expected of a certain University.

General advice that I can give someone is that you really need to make time to work on yourself as a person. Find what you want to do in life, find what you must do to achieve this. And then you have to find a way to fall in love with the things you must do to reach your end goal.

DO STUDENTS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH AFRICA (UNISA) QUALIFY?

Yes, you can get funded but it works differently. Since UNISA's programmes are offered online, certain allowances (such as accommodation) will not be offered. NSFAS funds the following for students at UNISA;

- Tuition fees
- Allowance for learning materials (textbooks or digital devices).

Unisa students who are registered for ten modules or more are also allocated an incidental allowance.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR NSFAS?

NSFAS applications for 2022 **will open on 01 September 2021 until 30 November 2021**. Note that NSFAS does not accept emailed or posted applications.

NSFAS applications must be done online through the myNSFAS portal. You can reach the myNSFAS portal through this link: <https://my.nsfas.org.za/Application/selfservice.jsp>

You will need to create a myNSFAS account. To do this, you will need a copy of your ID or birth certificate with your correct ID number as well your full name and surname that is indicated on your ID or birth certificate.

If you already have a myNSFAS account, then all you'll need to do is log in and then start applying. You cannot create more than one account on the portal for yourself.

You will then need to give your consent to allow NSFAS to verify your personal information with third parties, such as Home Affairs before your profile is completely created. This is all done online, and you won't need to submit or upload a consent form. You also need to accept the terms and conditions.

Your ID number will be linked to your name and surname and your parents' details through Home Affairs.

You will also need to submit the following documents with your application:

- A copy of your ID
- Parent/guardian's proof of income
- Copies of your parent/guardian's IDs
- Disability Annexure A for applicants with disabilities

- be prepared to undergo any training as determined by the National Commissioner of the SAPS

The South African Navy

The South African Navy (SAN) is one of the Arms of Service of the South African National Defence Force (SANDF).

The Navy's core business is to "Fight at Sea", thereby protecting South Africa's coastlines and marine resources. For this reason, the South African Navy uses ships and submarines to conduct its business and its fleet is based in Simon's Town (Cape Town) and Durban.

The SA Navy has a Naval Station in Port Elizabeth. The Headquarters is situated in Pretoria.

Military Skills Development Programme

The Military Skills Development (MSD) Programme is a two-year programme that encompasses the philosophy of lifelong learning to equip new recruits with knowledge, skills and experience to make them employable and marketable within the SA Navy, as well as in the public and private sectors.

Recruits are provided with various skills ranging from seamanship, environmental awareness, musketry, computer skills, basic financial management skills, hygiene and discipline to work ethics. All basic training in the SA Navy begins at SAS SALDANHA, in Saldanha Bay, where the Military Training for Ratings (MTR) takes place.

Officer training is carried out at the SA Naval College in Gordon's Bay, whilst specialist training is conducted at SAS SIMONSBURG in Simon's Town.

At SAS SALDANHA candidates are selected to go to the SA Naval College in Gordon's Bay where they will undergo intensive officer training before filling posts in the Combat, Logistics, Personnel and Engineering branches of the SA Navy. Junior ratings will receive specialised training for utilisation in mustering areas (functional areas) such as Combat Operators, Divers, Protection Force, Hospitality, Logistics, Radar Operators, Engine Room Attendants and Personnel Clerks.

After a period of two years' service, suitable MSD members will be recruited into the Core Service System. The remainder will be transferred to the Reserve Force for a period of five years where they will be used in prominent posts to complement the Full-Time Force.

Those leaving the Navy on completion of MSD training will be equipped with skills that will make them competitive in the labour market.

Protection Force

This is the mustering that is responsible for the maintenance of security within the South African Navy. The second year MSD Sailors must undergo a 10-week long Protection Part 1 course that is presented in Simon's Town.

Some of the subjects covered in this course are: Roadblocks; Searching of Vehicles and Buildings; Clearing of Buildings; Cordoning- Off of Buildings; Weapon Handling (which includes the 9mm pistol, shotgun, R5 rifle and LMG medium machine-gun); Identifying of Basic Explosives; Evacuation Procedures in the Event of Fires and Bomb Scares; Protection of the Vulnerable Parts of the Base; Escorting of VIPs; etc.

After this course, the Sailors are sent to various Naval Units where they complete the rest of the year as Protection Force Personnel.

Engine Room Attendants

The Engine Room Attendants (ERAT) mustering teaches the basic technical skills required for those Sailors who are selected to be attendants in the engine rooms of ships and submarines.

This 6-week long course is presented at SAS WINGFIELD in Cape Town. Some of the subjects that are presented include the Basic Mechanical Course, Introduction to Internal Combustion Engines, Basic Maritime Refrigeration, Basic Outboard Motors, Lubrication, Hand Tools, Maintenance Planning, Ship Systems, Propellers and Shafting, and Safety in the Workshop. On completion of this course the Sailors are sent to various base workshops, ships and submarines.

Public Relations

The SA Navy has a Public Relations mustering and some of the Sailors spend their second year in this mustering. The Sailors all undergo the Public Relations Institute of South Africa (PRISA) Basic Principles of Public Relations course.

In their second year they are exposed to all facets of the Public Relations field in the Navy, which includes media relations, conducting visits, manning shows and exhibitions, basic photography, office administration and events management.

Human Resource Management

The Navy manages its own personnel administration by means of the Personnel mustering. The second year MSD Sailors in this mustering must undergo a 6-month course in Pretoria where the following subjects are presented: Conventions of Service Writing; Signal Writing; Managing the Computer- Based Remuneration System; Human Resource Functioning; Human Resource Maintenance; Labour and Service Relations; and Client Service.

Hospitality Services

The Navy conducts its own hospitality service and hence requires professional and dedicated chefs and stewards to fulfil this function. MSD Sailors who are interested in becoming chefs or stewards are sent to Catering School in Simon's Town for an 8-week Caterers' Part 1 course.

During this course they are introduced to subjects for both chefs and stewards, which means that they can be used in either field. Some of the subjects that they complete on this course are: Basic Principles of Cooking; Hygiene; Principles of the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHASA); Wine and Bar Services; The Art of Entertainment; Equipment and Utensils; Victualing; Menu Planning; and Nutrition.

Fire-fighting services

Fires on ships are one of the worst threats in the maritime industry and hence all Navy personnel are trained to combat fires.

In addition to this, the Navy also has its own dedicated fire-fighting service to combat both shore-base and ship fires. The formal fire-fighting qualification that the MSD Sailors obtain is valid for 7 months and includes the following modules: hazardous material awareness and operation; fire-fighting; advanced fire-fighting; petro-chemical fire-fighting; and bush fires.

The course is very practically orientated and although the theory part is important, it comprises only 20% of the course. In addition to these qualifications, the Sailors in this branch also complete a basic ambulance course that is the equivalent of First Aid Level 5.

Logistics

In any large organisation the logistic department is vitally important to ensure the smooth functioning of all the facets of the organisation. The course presented to the Sailors is 5 weeks long and it is done in Cape Town. Some of the subjects taken are the following: Stocktaking; Damage, Loss and Control of State Property; Receipt, Storage and Transportation of Equipment and Material; Packing, Unpacking and Transportation of Equipment and Material; Principles of Accounting and Accounting Documents; and Material Controlling Authorities.

Physical Training

As the Navy is a fighting force, the physical fitness of its members is of the utmost importance. The Navy has a branch of trained Physical Training Instructors (PTIs) who must ensure that the physical fitness of naval members does not deteriorate.

The qualified PTIs are expected to know the rules of sports, which will allow them to coach the Sailors in the following sports: rugby; cross-country running; tug of war; volleyball; military pentathlon; soccer; and orienteering.

Maritime Reaction Squadron

The main aim of this specialised unit is to deploy members in various peacekeeping roles within the African continent and to assist in boarding operations at sea, humanitarian operations and disaster relief. The role of the MRS in the Navy is to provide VIP Protection services, conduct observer missions and use boats to carry out patrols.

Navy Divers

The SA Navy offers young men and women excellent diving training opportunities which are both physically and psychologically challenging.

The role of the Mine Counter Measure (MCM) squadron is to provide specialised divers, equipment and boats to carry out Mine Counter Measure operations to keep all of South Africa's harbours and waters clear of any underwater threats such as mines and underwater Improvised Explosive Devices.

Combat Officers

Combat Officers are responsible for executing the Navy's main function, which is Maritime Warfare. These officers man the Navy's ships and lead the Navy's combat element. Naturally they are highly motivated, well-trained leaders with the necessary expertise in putting complex computerised weaponry to effective use.

Although this career makes high personal demands, it is unique and very stimulating. The peak of many a Combat Officer's career is taking command of a warship.

Engineering

The acquisition of new ships, submarines and modern weapon system provides an exciting and dynamic career for SA Naval Engineers. This branch renders important support to the combat element by means of maintaining operational ships and equipment in a continued state of readiness.

This is achieved through the maintenance and modification of existing weapons, electronics and propulsion systems and the design and development of new systems.

After completion of the first year of military and officers training, student engineers will commence studies in Mechanical, Electronic or Electrical Engineering at the Universities of Stellenbosch or Cape Town.

Hydrography

The South African Navy Hydrographic Office (SANHO) has played an essential role in supporting safe navigation at sea in the South African region. The SANHO is recognized as the Centre of Hydrographic excellence in Africa by the International Hydrographic Community through its proven professional conduct, products, innovation and supreme service.

The SANHO is the national producer of paper charts, electronic navigational charts (ENCs) and publications. The mission of the SANHO is to meet National, Defence and Commercial customers' needs for navigational charts and other hydrographic information, in support of safe navigation.

Naval Publications

The Naval Publications Unit delivers full lithographic services to the South African National Defence Force. The division undertakes a variety of tasks that includes printing all Naval Charts and Hydrographic Publications, maps for the Army and Periodicals for the Navy, Air Force and Medical Services, as well as Naval Technical Publications, various forms and certificates. They also produce certain courtesy documents such as letterheads, invitations, business cards and programmes for official functions and visits.

Communication

The nature of the Navy's communication requirements necessitates that all formal communication is conducted in a secure format. Thus the communication mustering is very important to safeguard the integrity of communication within the Navy.

The MSD Sailors who go into this branch have to complete the Communication Part 1 course in Simon's Town, which is 9 months long. Some of the subjects covered include Morse Code, Telex Net, Ceremonial, Flags and Pennants, Voice and Radio Procedures, Flashing Lights, Semaphore and Microsoft Word. Once the Sailors have completed this course they are sent as communication assistants to various shore units, ships and submarines.

Naval Technical Officers work closely with Naval Engineering Officers. The acquisition of new vessels and modern armament and electronic systems provides a dynamic career for Naval Technical Officers.

After completion of the first year of military and officers training, student naval technical officers will commence studies in Mechanical, Electronic or Electrical Engineering at the Cape Peninsula University of Technology or Durban University of Technology.

Anyone applying for the above- mentioned functional areas must

- be a South African citizen;
- be between the age of 18 and 22 (for graduates up to the age of 26);
- have completed or be in the process of completing the National Senior Certificate (Grade 12);
- preferably be single;
- not be area bound;
- have no record of a criminal offence; and
- comply with the medical fitness requirements for appointment in the SANDF.

Divers: Due to the requirements of this occupation, applicants must have no physical disabilities and not suffer from claustrophobia or a fear of heights. Applicants should be strong swimmers with a flair for general water activities.

Local girl serves in the Army

For most South Africans, furthering their studies is not an option. This was the case with Leonita Swartz, a former pupil at Ceres Secondary School, who could not afford to attend any tertiary institutions. Although bursary options were available, Leonita needed to urgently provide for her family and the quickest way to do this was to join the Army. She filled out the relevant forms and four months later, she was chosen for pre-selections. When joining the army, you can decide which wing you want to serve, either the Army, Navy, Airforce, or Military Health Services. Leonita got into the Army. "I am in logistics. We wear blue berets. I am working in an office and do procurement. That means I am part of the team who purchases the necessary items" says Leonita. According to her, the Army has its challenges, "It is important that you have some backbone when joining the army. You need to have the stamina to never give up." Another challenge includes location, "You could be placed far from home. I am at this moment in Potchefstroom", says Leonita. However, the Army also provides lots of opportunities. "You see many other places and I am somebody who loves to explore."



"We also get the opportunity to study further in the Army and the studies are paid for, as long as we don't fail." The Army comes with several responsibilities and pressure and although it might not be for everyone, Leonita has demonstrated that it offers a lot for those who serve. The Chrysalis Academy is a youth leadership development organisation as well as a social crime prevention initiative, empowering young people to take responsibility for their personal growth. Closing thoughts

This booklet is not the alpha and Omega. There is a worldwide web, the Internet, with all relevant information about your planned field of study. You should do your research there too because all the educational institutions have their own websites.

Do the research:

The purpose of research is to provide a broad overview of the field that you will be studying towards such as career opportunities

Without proper research, you could land up in an incorrect field, in which you have no interest in. This can result in you having up to 3 incomplete degrees and still not knowing what you should actually be studying.

With the correct guidance, your research could be completed without fail.

Matric requirements

- Marks should at least meet the minimum requirements. If you are short with 1 or even a $\frac{1}{2}$ mark you will most probably not be admitted for that particular degree or diploma.
- You must do well in all your subjects in order for the APS score to be high to ensure your admittance. (An APS or Admission **Points Score** is the converted average of your matric marks. Each mark is converted to a mark out of ten. These marks then all added together to give you an **APS**. Your **APS** determines if you are eligible for a specific tertiary education course.)
- Simply meeting the minimum requirements are not always enough as the Universities receive a lot of applicants and choose the ones with the highest APS scores. The higher your marks the better your chances.
- Your subjects must be correctly chosen for the degree that you need to study from school level

Bursaries should be applied for in advance (before the closing dates) and ensure that all terms and conditions are understood.

It is very important that you apply to various Universities/ Colleges and not only your main choice. This will provide you with alternative options should you not get accepted to your first choice University/ College. Keep in mind that is where research comes in once again.

Not all children are University material (that does not mean that they are stupid, weak or incapable, but it basically means that we need to look into their career opportunity and the fact that they could be capable to study at one of the Colleges that does offer what they want to study) for example to become an electrician, plumber, fitter and turner, social worker, human resource manager etc.

Do a lot of research which will assist you in studying into the correct field

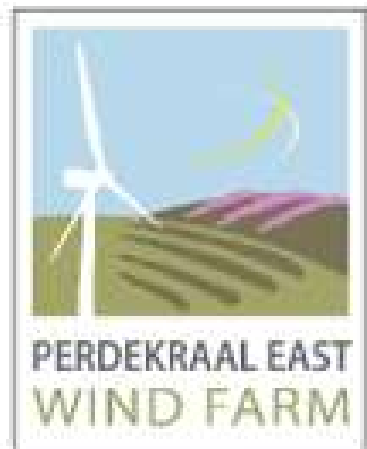
- Make sure you study in a field that have enough work opportunities or you will end up sitting with a degree or diploma but cannot find any work
